Dear Yosemite NHPA Partners:

The National Park Service (NPS) at Yosemite National Park is working with the University of California, Santa Barbara (UCSB), and the Center for Collaborative Policy at Sacramento State University to complete a study to understand and address the hydrology of the Merced River within the vicinity of the historic Sugar Pine Bridge. This research is meant to provide detailed information about the scientific approaches and methods proposed to improve river conditions while retaining the historic bridge.

Consistent with the stipulations in the Merced River Plan Programmatic Agreement, the park is inviting the NHPA Section 106 partners to a consultation meeting regarding the scope of the proposed study. We anticipate this being a half-day meeting (likely mid-day for travel) in which the consulting partners would be able to ask questions of the scientists as well as express any concerns to the park staff coordinating the work. We have attached a link to a Doodle Poll to determine which dates work best for you. From your responses we hope to identify a meeting date and time that will work for everybody.
